

**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN
DYNAMO INTERNATIONAL,
THE CONSORTIUM FOR STREET CHILDREN, AND
INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF LIONS CLUBS**

1 Purpose

1.1 The Purpose of the Memorandum of Understanding is to establish a cooperative alliance between Dynamo International (hereinafter "Dynamo"), the Consortium for Street Children (hereinafter "CSC"), and the International Association of Lions Clubs, also known as Lions Clubs International (hereinafter "LCI"). Dynamo, CSC and LCI are hereinafter jointly referred to as the "Parties."

1.2 The spirit of this cooperation is to increase actions in favour of the children in street situations.

1.3 This Memorandum details the framework for cooperation between the three organizations.

2 Parties

2.1 Dynamo International (Dynamo),

Dynamo International has the social purpose of development cooperation especially in the fields related to children and youth in street situations, education and social street work. Dynamo International street worker network represents the interests of worldwide social street workers in policy development, networking at national, regional and international levels aiming at improving the living conditions of people of the street.

2.2 Consortium for Street Children (CSC),

The Consortium for Street Children is a global network that exists to give street children a voice, promote their rights and improve their lives. CSC seeks to be the leading international network dedicated to realizing the rights of street children worldwide. This is done through a focus on advocacy, research, and development.

2.3 The International Association of Lions Clubs (LCI),

LCI is the largest volunteer service organization in the world. LCI's 1.4 million members in more than 48,000 clubs provide humanitarian service in more than 200 countries and geographical areas around the globe. Since 1917, Lions have aided the blind and visually impaired, championed youth initiatives and strengthened communities through hands on service and humanitarian projects. LCI has selected diabetes as the initial focal area for development, one of the new global causes that illustrates the humanitarian areas LCI will support. LCI will engage key partners to assist in the development, implementation and assessment of initiatives related to the diabetes platform.

3 Cooperative Alliance Components

3.1 Dynamo International, the Consortium of Street Children and Lions Clubs International have agreed to come together in a partnership envisioned to achieve their common

objective of increasing the efficiency of their actions in favour of the children in street situations.

3.2 The partnership will focus on:

- The expertise of Dynamo International, which includes:
 - Guidelines for the development and implementation of projects.
 - Trainings on the issues of children in a street situation and social street work.
 - Expertise for all issues related to social street work.
 - Liaise between clubs around the world and of social street workers teams.
- The expertise of the Consortium for Street Children, which includes:
 - Expertise for issues related to street-connected children in general and particularly on the UN General Comment on Children in Street Situations, and International Day for Street Children.
 - Organization of the UN General Comment launch and orchestration of online activities for International Day for Street Children.
 - Research on street connected children and developing robust methods of counting.
 - Trainings associated with advocacy, campaigning, legal and policy change for street connected children.
- Local Lions clubs participating as determined by the respective Lions club.

3.3 The Parties agree to each designate a relationship manager for the long term monitoring and management of this partnership. The Parties may also decide to form working groups comprising representatives of each Party, which will be responsible for monitoring the development and execution of the Activities.

4 Term

4.1 The term of this MoU shall be for two (2) years beginning the date of signature by all parties. Six months prior to the renewal date, both parties shall review the progress of the MoU and determine whether to extend the MoU for additional two-year terms. Both parties understand that this MoU may be terminated at any time upon written notification from either party to the other. Any subsequent agreement(s) concluded pursuant to this MoU may also be terminated in accordance with the termination provision contained in such agreements.

5 Conditions

5.1 Nothing in this MoU shall be construed as obliging Dynamo, CSC or LCI to specific expenditures, any further programmatic obligation or payment of money, provision of materials without charge, or the endorsement of an advocacy position.

5.2 Dynamo, CSC and LCI acknowledge that each party may provide materials for the other's use that are protected by copyright, including written, audio visual, and electronic works or other proprietary information including membership/chapter data. Each party shall use the materials and information only for the purpose and in the manner agreed to by the providing party and shall not reproduce, distribute, sell, or otherwise exploit them in whole or in part except with the express prior written permission of the providing party.


5.3 Each party acknowledges that they possess certain trademarks, logos, emblems and trade names including, "Dynamo International," "Consortium for Street Children" and "The International Association of Lions Clubs, Lions Clubs International, Lions, and Lions Clubs." Neither party shall use, reproduce, or exploit the trademarks, logos, emblems or trade names of the other except for the purpose and in the manner explicitly authorized by the party concerned.

5.4 Nothing in this MoU shall constitute or be deemed a waiver, express or implied, of any of the privileges and immunities of the International Diabetes Federation or the International Association of Lions Clubs.

6 Modification

6.1 The terms of this Memorandum of Understanding may be modified at any time by mutual agreement in writing signed by both parties.




